WHEREAS, October 21, 2016, was declared as Reilly Arts Center Day in recognition of the venue's one year anniversary, and today marks the tenth anniversary of the venue's opening.

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners of Marion County, Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in us do hereby proclaim that **October 21, 2025** be known as

"Reilly Arts Center Day"

in Marion County, Florida, and encourage all citizens to join in recognizing and celebrating the Reilly Arts Center for its enduring impact on the cultural and artistic life of our community.
