

Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR)

FY 24/25 - 3nd Quarter Accomplishments (April - June):

Public Safety - Manage the Increased Demand for Emergency Services

- 1. Finalized with Levy County for formal Interlocal Agreement for Mutual Aid agreement for Fire Rescue Services.
- 2. Addition of resources to the fire stations
 - a. The new hires in training classes will graduate from fire and EMT school and enter the workforce.
- Utilized the 2 new slide in units for UTV's to transport patients. Need identified during Rock the Country concert. Two additional patient moving trays (slide ins that fit in our current side-by-side's).

Public Safety – Public Safety Equipment

- 1. Upgrade Fire and EMS equipment
 - a. Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR) will soon be upgrading its LIFEPAK 15 monitors to the next-generation LIFEPAK 35 devices. On January 21, 2025, the Board of County Commissioners approved the purchase of 100 LIFEPAK 35 units at a total cost of \$4.2 million. This investment reflects the county's dedication to supporting our mission.
 - b. MCFR ordered a new water tanker, and it is in the build stage.
 - c. MCFR received word that we will have 16 ambulance chassis in the process of being built. The expected delivery of the first round would be in July.
 - d. MCFR ordered 2 Engines. These are in build status and are awaiting delivery.

Public Safety - Community Paramedicine and Opioid Response

- 1. Increase access to care for mental health and substance abuse.
- MCFR added five additional Community Paramedics to the system to expand its capacity to address mental health, substance use, and high-utilizer populations. This includes placing additional Community Paramedicine units in service through the Florida CORE program.
- 3. Add additional Community Paramedicine resources based on system demand.
 - a. MCFR is exploring funding options with shareholders for expansion.



FY 24/25 – 4th Quarter Goals (July-Oct):

Public Safety – Manage the Increased Demand for Emergency Services

- 1. Addition of resources to the fire stations.
 - a. MCFR will prepare for additional transport units in service at Station17 and Station 4 for FY 25/26.
 - b. The new hire training classes will graduate from fire school and enter the workforce.

Public Safety – Public Safety Equipment

- 1. Upgrade Fire and EMS equipment
 - a. MCFR executed the newly awarded \$32,000 in State EMS Grant funding for equipment purchases to expand services.
 - b. MCFR was tentatively awarded \$500,000 in Opioid Settlement monies. These funds will be used to offset our current budget and expand services.
 - c. Lifepack 35's will be implemented into the field by August 1st.
 - d. Three new tankers in production. One all-wheel drive should be delivered in July.
 - e. 2 engines ordered. Expected deliveries 2026.
 - f. 14 rescues in production. Expected to receive by November.
 - g. Grass truck expected to be delivered in July.
