911 Management and Public Safety Communications

FY 23/24 – 1st Quarter Accomplishments (October - December):

Public Safety

1. Implement ESInet
 - a. Attending meetings with our Region 3 partners to continue to gather information. *This item, while separate, is linked to the implementation of NGCS (Next Generation Core Services).
2. Regional Back-Up Plan
 - a. Draft MOU with Alachua County is currently being reviewed by Legal to establish a reciprocal back-up.
 - b. Continuing discussions with additional counties to identify which counties have the capacity to handle Marion County's 911 traffic should the need arise once NGCS is fully implemented.
3. Implementation of Next Generation 911 Core Services
 - a. Attending meetings with our Region 3 partners to continue to gather information.
 - b. Implementation of our Regional Mapping Repository has begun –
 - GIS data has been updated to meet the NENA Standards.
 - Boundary facilitation meetings have been conducted and 5 of the 7 counties boundaries have been agreed upon. We're still working with Lake & Alachua counties.

FY 23/24 – 2nd Quarter Goals (January - March):

Public Safety

1. Implement ESInet
 - a. Continue to attend bi-weekly meetings with our Region 3 partners to gather information. *This item, while separate, is linked to the implementation of NGCS (Next Generation Core Services).
2. Regional Back-Up Plan
 - a. Continue to narrow down a short list of counties within the region that can serve as a reciprocal backup site for the uninterrupted processing of 911 calls should a catastrophic event affect Marion County's 911 communication operations.
3. Implementation of Next Generation 911 Core Services
 - a. Develop a short list of NGCS providers and begin gathering information to do a comparison of their services and pricing models.
 - b. Continue working with DataMark for the implementation of our regional GIS mapping repository.
