WHEREAS, Marion County is committed to working with Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida and local agencies like Interfaith; His Compassion; The Salvation Army; and Brother's Keeper; to name a few; in their efforts to bring awareness and help end hunger in our community; and

WHEREAS, the month of September is designated "Hunger Action Month" to bring attention to food insecurity and to enlist the public in the fight to end hunger by donating, fundraising, volunteering, learning about hunger in their community, or advocating for food assistance; and

WHEREAS, food banks across the country, including the members of the Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida, will host numerous events throughout the month of September to bring awareness and help end hunger in their local community;

NOW THEREFORE, the Board of County Commissioners of Marion County, Florida, by virtue of the authority vested in us do hereby proclaim that **September 2024** be known as

"Hunger Action Month"

in Marion County, Florida, and urge all citizens to help "Stock the Shelves" this September to help families, kids, seniors, and the disadvantaged facing hunger.
