Public Safety Communications

FY 23/24 – 2nd Quarter Goals (January – March):

Public Safety

1. Enhance Cybersecurity for Mission-Critical Systems
 - a. Continue implementation of cybersecurity protections for the P25 7/800 radio and the 9-1-1 telephony systems shared with the Ocala Police Department (OPD).
 - b. Completed failover test of the backup/disaster recovery (DR) communications center in conjunction with Marion County Information Technology and other public safety agency stakeholders comprising Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR), the Marion County Sheriff's Office (MCSO), and the City of Ocala Police (OPD) and Fire departments (OFD).
2. Radio System Refurbishment/Expansion of Existing Infrastructure and Equipment Upgrades
 - a. Continue to finalize development of joint expectations of Wi-Fi SSID and MAC requirements with public safety stakeholders, including MCPS and the Marion County Courthouse.
 - b. Continue development of interlocal agreement efforts with public safety stakeholders to govern:
 - i. utilization of the P25 7/800 MHz radio system and workflow related to dispatch of resources to emergency situations involving school buses; and
 - ii. utilization of MCPS Wi-Fi network to enable functionality of upgraded portable radio equipment inside of hardened buildings on school; and deployment to field responders portable radio equipment upgraded to function inside of hardened struct
