

## **POLICY 06-01**

It is the policy of the Marion County Board of County Commissioners that the procedures for the ceremonial dedication of a roadway, or portion thereof, within Marion County shall be as follows:

1. Roadways will only be named ceremoniously. This does not change the legal name as it pertains to 911 Addressing, Emergency Management, United States Postal Service or any other official designation.
2. Roadways shall only be named after a Marion County citizen who, through their deeds, actions, and level of community involvement, has made a lasting impact and has made a significant contribution to the community as a whole.
3. The applicant shall submit a written request to the Commissioner whose district contains the subject roadway. The request shall include the exact location of the roadway, or portion thereof, the length of the roadway to be dedicated, and justification for the request.
4. The written request must also be accompanied by three (3) letters of support from members of the community.
5. The Commissioner receiving the request will review for appropriateness with regard to historical, cultural, or geographic significance of the commemoration and to verify that the request is in the public interest.
6. The Commissioner will then present the request at a regular Board of County Commissioners meeting for consideration and approval.
7. If approved, the applicant shall coordinate with County Administration staff with regard to date, time, location, signage, ceremony, and public notice.
