#### **Classifications of Project Types**

- Asset Replacement Program
  - Maintenance and replacement projects
  - Funded through Fees fund
- Expansion Projects
  - Projects that increase the availability for recreation
  - □ New parks, additions to existing parks, addition of new amenities to existing parks

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## **Asset Replacement Program**



#### **Project Descriptions**

- Existing park projects identified through community feedback and staff insight.
- Maintenance projects.
- Life expectancy and asset replacement schedule.

Priority 1: Safety related projects

Priority 2: Internal assessment of existing conditions

Current cost of known ARP projects: \$19,403,750

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## **Top Asset Replacement Priorities**



#### **Asset Replacement Priorities:**

- 1. Structural Assessments: \$100,000
  - a. KP Hole Park retaining wall structural assessment: \$25,000
  - b. Brick City Adventure Park grandstand structural assessment: \$25,000
  - c. Brick City Adventure Park retaining wall structural assessment: \$25,000
  - d. Coehadjoe Park racquet ball court assessment: \$25,000
- 2. Multiple parks erosion mitigation at pavilions (14): \$19,500
- 3. Rotary Sportsplex Score keeper tower repairs/renovation: \$25,000
- 4. Baseline Road Trailhead Park replace playground: \$1,705,000
- 5. Safety Netting: \$575,000
  - a. Belleview Sportsplex safety netting: \$400,000
  - b. John Van Fleet safety netting: \$105,000
  - c. Ralph Russell Park safety netting: \$70,000

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## **Expansion Projects**



#### **Project Descriptions**

- Projects that increase the availability for recreation and general use.
- New parks, additions to existing parks, new amenities to existing parks.
- Projects that have good return on the investment.

Priority 1: Projects that are in demand.

Priority 2: Projects that have a strong return on investment.

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## **Top Expansion Project Priorities**



#### **Expansion Project Priorities:**

- 1. Shocker Adjacent: \$1,700,000
  - a. Mass grading: \$200,000
  - b. Entry road, parking, stormwater: \$750,000
  - c. Utility infrastructure: \$250,000
  - d. Irrigation, sprigging: \$200,000
  - e. Lighting: \$300,000
- 2. Carney Island RV campground and boat storage: \$3,175,000
- 3. Independence/SW 49th Ave. Park new park: \$3,305,000
- 4. Blue Run bathroom: \$450,000
- 5. Belleview Sportsplex: \$410,000
  - a. Remove mobile office: \$50,000
  - b. Relocate maintenance shop: \$360,000

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## Fun with Funding



#### How are other Parks & Recreation departments funded across Florida?

- 23 counties utilize Impact Fees
- 4 counties utilize MSTU
- 16 counties utilize bond funding

20% of cities utilize Impact Fees 1% of cities utilize MSTU/MSBU 6% of cities utilize bond funding

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## Fee In-Lieu Program



#### Fee In-Lieu Program

- Program is in the current Recreation and Open Space Element.
- Allows developers to make payment to the County in-lieu of providing open space and/or recreation amenities in new developments.
- Develop policy on use/implementation and make it a viable program.

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## **Impact Fees**



#### **Impact Fees**

- Ideal method of funding Expansion Projects.
- Great opportunity to create capital funding; accrual-based.
- New developments create new needs for access to parks.
- Where they are collected and what rate:
  - □ Different size developments will have different Amenity Center requirements which will impact whether Impact Fees can be collected in those areas.
  - Start with a small fee.
  - □ Not all new homes are in new developments.

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## **General Fund**



#### **Combined General Fund Cost**

- General Fund money to be allocated to Expansion Projects based on the need of the community and prioritization.
- Utilize a paced and prioritized plan.
  - □ First Expansion Project: Shocker Park (Adjacent)
  - Second Expansion Project: Carney Island RV Campground and Storage
  - □ Third Expansion Project: SW 49<sup>th</sup> Ave Park

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# Assessment (MSBU)



#### **County-wide Assessment**

- Can be assigned across unincorporated areas of the County.
- Used to offset operational costs for parks that benefit the entire county.
  - Conservation areas
  - Passive recreation areas
  - ☐ Flood protection areas in parks

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# Quality of Life Bond



#### **Quality of Life Bond**

- Green ballot initiatives in Florida success rate.
- Voter approval needed.
- Great program for capital infusion.

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## **Grants and Sponsorships**



- Grants and sponsorships as money that can help increase VELOCITY of improvements.
- Grants are generally competitive: we will be competing against others for the same money with no guarantee of being awarded any funding.
- Propose to allocate \$200,000 per year as "match money" from Fees.
- Sponsorships are also funding sources of opportunity. There are a lot of factors that must align at the right time for a sponsorship or donation to land.

## Bed Tax and Public-Private Partnerships (P3)



- Bed tax is funding, that if available, may be granted towards projects that qualify under state statute.
- Use for larger "destination parks" or amenities that host tourism events.
- P3 are cross-sector partnerships that can bridge the gap between community needs and available public resources.
- P3 all depends on private sector interest.
- P3 are usually for significantly larger projects that the private sector sees value and a significant return on their investment.

Current Project Funding: \$2,327,911.25

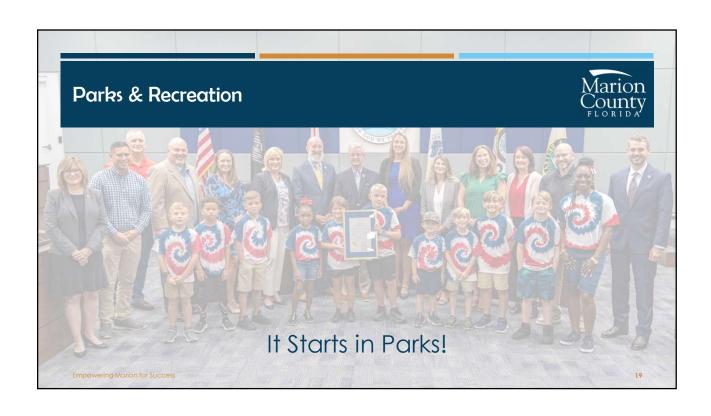
