Marion County Fire Rescue (MCFR)

FY 24/25 – 4th Quarter Accomplishments (July - September):

Public Safety – Manage the Increased Demand for Emergency Services

1. Addition of resources to the fire stations.
 - a. R 504 and R 517 place in service in their respective stations starting 10/18/2025
 - b. The new hire training classes will graduate from fire school and enter the workforce.
 - c. Added Associate Medical Director (Dr. Reed) to MCFR.

Public Safety – Public Safety Equipment

1. Upgrade Fire and EMS equipment
 - a. Lifepack 35's were implemented into the field by August 1st.
 - b. Grass truck expected to be delivered in July.
 - c. Engines
 - a. 2 new expected delivery Summer/Fall 2026
 - b. 1 new being ordered 2nd Oct BOCC meeting
 - c. 2 refurb beginning Nov/Dec 2025
 - d. Tankers
 - a. 2 new expected delivery Nov 2025
 - b. 1 remount being ordered 2nd Oct BOCC meeting
 - e. Brush truck
 - a. 1 new being ordered Nov BOCC meeting
 - f. Transport Trucks
 - a. 6 New in production expecting delivery Dec 2025
 - b. 3 New in production expecting delivery Mar/Apr 2026
 - c. 4 New in production expecting delivery Sep/Oct 2026
 - d. 1 remount in production expecting delivery Jan/Feb 2026
 - e. 1 remount in production expecting delivery Mar/Apr 2026
 - f. Remount will begin Nov 2025
 - g. 4 new being ordered 2nd Oct BOCC meeting
 - h. 4 remount chassis being ordered 2nd Oct BOCC meeting
 - i. Remounts will begin Spring 2026

Public Safety – Community Paramedicine and Opioid Response

1. Increase access to care for mental health and substance abuse.
 - a. Expanding Community Paramedicine services into individual Battalions with dedicated teams assigned to each Battalion.
2. Add additional Community Paramedicine resources based on system demand.
 - a. MCFR is exploring funding options with shareholders for expansion.

FY 25/26 – 1st Quarter Goals (October -December):
